OBSERVATION 3: OBSERVATION OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS (ELL)

Students who are English Language Learners are classified as Limited English Proficient (LEP) or Immigrant Children and Youth.

- Observation 3 focus: Teacher interns will work with mentor teachers involving ELL instruction to develop their knowledge, skills, and professional dispositions for working with ELL students.
- 2. You must work with your Classroom Mentor Teacher to locate a classroom within your school district that has at least one ELL student. The class could be a different content area and grade level, i.e. elementary education intern could observe a biology class that has an ELL student. If you are unable to find a classroom with an ELL student within your school district of placement, contact the Director of OCFBI for assistance.
- 3. Explain the purpose of the observation to the teacher that has the ELL student/s. (This is not an evaluation of the teacher's performance. It is an opportunity for beginning teachers to learn from professional educators.)
- 4. Focus on the objectives/goals of this observation.
- 5. Provide written documentation of Observation 3 in Taskstream. The paper submitted in Taskstream should address Part I: Observation and Part II: Analysis/Reflection (requirements explained in the directions below). This assignment can be submitted as an attachment in Taskstream. The evaluation section in Taskstream has a copy of the rubric that will be used to assess the assignment.

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PART I: Observation

Address the following from Observation 3: A Teacher with ELL student/s in the Classroom

- 1. What language/s were the student/s fluent in apart from English? (native language/s)
- 2. How was the classroom with ELL students managed to promote a deeper understanding of lesson content?
- 3. How was the management for the classroom that contains ELL students different from the classroom that you observed in Observation 2?
- 4. What evidence did you observe that showed ELL students gained a better understanding of the content being delivered?

PART II: Analysis/Reflection

Address the following from Observation 3: A Teacher with ELL student/s in the Classroom

- 1. What qualities did the teacher demonstrate that were successful? What could be done differently by the teacher to improve learning outcomes?
- 2. How did the teacher foster learning and address learning needs?
- 3. What were the characteristics of the ELL students?
 - a. Did they participate in the lesson?
 - b. Did they seem to understand the objectives of the lesson?
 - c. Were they able to apply concepts taught within the lesson?
- 4. Explain how what you observed will be helpful in future teaching situations.
